Resident Rights: How is my loved one protected?

Residents' Rights are guaranteed by the federal 1987 Nursing Home Reform Law. The law requires nursing homes to "promote and protect the rights of each resident" and places a strong emphasis on individual dignity and self-determination. Nursing homes must meet federal residents' rights requirements if they participate in Medicare or Medicaid. Kansas also has residents' rights in state regulations for nursing homes, assisted living, Home Plus facilities, adult care homes, and other board and care facilities. A person living in a long-term care facility maintains the same rights as an individual in the larger community.

We have integrated Resident Rights education into our monthly resident council meetings. Our goal is to continue educating residents after admission of their rights and to ensure they feel all their needs are being met as well as their rights are being protected. Each month we will go over a section of rights in depth and help dissect the meaning of each with our residents.

Resident rights are very important and at Prairie Senior we follow a person centered care approach where the resident is the center of their care plan. This goes hand in hand with resident rights. Resident rights can be found in the chapel at Prairie Senior. You can also find more information on resident rights by visiting the Kansas Long-Term Care Ombudsman website.
